**Parking in Hawkenbury Area**

As you may be aware, since the occupation of the old Land Registry building by AXA PPP, on-street parking has become problematical in certain streets around Hawkenbury. As part of their planning consent for an extension to the building, AXA PPP were required to provide funding for a review of on-street parking and the introduction of any restrictions deemed necessary as a consequence.

The purpose of this letter is to seek residents views so that we can move forward to specific proposals and a formal consultation. At this stage therefore, we would like to learn more about what you consider to be the main parking issues, if any, and what your preferred solutions are.

You may have noticed that we have already implemented some new yellow line restrictions, primarily around junctions to deal with the more pressing highway safety issues. It is now time to look at ways in which we can deal with the remaining, and probably more widespread, concerns.

One issue that we will be considering, and where your views are of particular interest, is the possibility of some form of resident priority parking. Before commenting on that, it is important to understand that there is an annual charge to residents for operating such a scheme, currently £60/year, which is reviewed from time to time.
