# Determination of an application for a premises licence – H & J Abode

### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT AND EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1.1 This report sets out details of an application for a premises licence.
- 1.2 In accordance with the provisions of Section 18(3) of the Licensing Act 2003 the licensing authority must hold a hearing to determine an application for a premises licence if relevant representations are made.
- 1.3 A representation is relevant if it relates to the likely effect of the grant of the licence on the promotion of at least one of the four licensing objectives. In other words, a representation should relate to the impact of licensable activities carried on at the premises on the objectives.
- 1.4 However, the Guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 recommends that: "In borderline cases, the benefit of the doubt about any aspect of a representation should be given to the person making that representation. The subsequent hearing would then provide an opportunity for the person or body making the representation to amplify and clarify it."

#### 2. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

- 2.1 On 8 August 2019 an online application, made under the provisions of section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003, was received for a new premises licence at H and J Abode Limited, Olive Stores, West Road, Goudhurst, Cranbrook, Kent TN17 1AB. A copy of the application form together with a plan of the premises is attached at **Appendix A**.
- 2.2 A map showing the location of the premises is attached at **Appendix B**. Please note the premises is shown as Hammerton Jones on this map.
- 2.3 In accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 (Premises licences and club premises certificates) Regulations 2005, a public notice was displayed at the premises for a period of 28 consecutive with the closing date for representations being 5 September 2019.
- 2.4 However it was discovered that the advertisement in a local newspaper had not been published and the applicant was therefore required to ensure that the advertisement appeared in the next available edition with a closing date for representations of 30 September 2019. Members are therefore requested to decide whether this demonstrates substantial compliance with the Regulations.
- 2.5 During the 28 day public consultation period a responsible authority or other person may make representations about the likely effect of the grant of the

application on the promotion of one or more of the licensing objectives, which are:

- Prevention of crime and disorder
- Prevention of public nuisance
- Public safety
- Protection of children from harm
- 2.6 If representations are received a hearing must be held to determine the application, providing that the grounds for the representation are relevant to the promotion of one or more of the licensing objectives and are not vexatious, frivolous or repetitive.
- 2.7 The application seeks authorisation for the following licensable activities: Live music (indoors)

Monday to Saturday 18:00 – 22:00

Sale or Supply of Alcohol (for consumption on the premises)

Monday to Saturday 09:00 – 22:00

- 2.8 With reference to Live Music, further details given at Section E (page 9) of the application form in **Appendix A** states "Live music will only consist of acoustic keyboard or guitar and only very occasionally upon customer request".
- 2.9 Members are reminded that following deregulation of some licensable activities, unamplified live music is no longer a licensable activity on any premises between 08:00 and 23:00 on any day. This part of the application can therefore be disregarded.
- 2.10 Two relevant representations objecting to the application for a premises licence were received from other persons based on one or more of the licensing objectives. Copies of the representations are attached at **Appendix C**.
- 2.11 No other relevant representations were received from responsible authorities or other persons within the 28 day consultation period prescribed by the Act.
- 2.12 The Guidance to Licensing Authorities issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 advises that it is imperative that the licensing authority ensures that the factors which form the basis of its determination are limited to consideration of the promotion of the licensing objectives and nothing outside those parameters.
- 2.13 The authority's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate to the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.
- 2.14 Moreover, decisions made in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 must not replicate or seek to enforce the statutory provisions of other legislation.

#### 3. AVAILABLE OPTIONS

- 3.1 Grant the licence subject to such conditions as are consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application modified to such extent as the licensing authority considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and any conditions which must under section 19, 20 or 21 of the Licensing Act 2003 be included in the licence; the mandatory conditions.
- 3.2 Exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates.
- 3.3 Refuse to specify the person named in the application as the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 3.4 Refuse the application.

#### 4. PREFERRED OPTION AND REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

- 4.1 That Members determine the application, and take such steps as the Sub-Committee consider necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives, giving appropriate weight to:
  - The merits of the application;
  - The representations and supporting information presented by all parties;
  - The Guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003;
  - The Council's Statement of Licensing Policy
- 4.2 For Members information if considering attaching conditions to a premises licence, paragraph 1.16 of the Guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 states:

Conditions on a premises licence or club premises certificate are important in setting the parameters within which premises can lawfully operate. The use of wording such as "must", "shall" and "will", is encouraged. Licence conditions:

- must be appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives;
- must be precise and enforceable;
- must be unambiguous and clear in what they intend to achieve;
- should not duplicate other statutory requirements or other duties or responsibilities placed on the employer by other legislation;
- must be tailored to the individual type, location and characteristics of the premises and events concerned;
- should not be standardised and may be unlawful when it cannot be demonstrated that they are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives in an individual case;
- should not replicate offences set out in the 2003 Act or other legislation;
- should be proportionate, justifiable and be capable of being met, (for example, whilst beer glasses may be available in toughened glass, wine glasses may not);
- cannot seek to manage the behaviour of customers once they are beyond
  the direct management of the licence holder and their staff, but may
  impact on the behaviour of customers in the immediate vicinity of the
  premises or as they enter or leave; and
- should be written in a prescriptive format

4.3 Paragraph 1.17 further advises that each application must be considered on its own merits and that conditions attached to licences and certificates must be tailored to the individual type, location and characteristics of the premises and events concerned. This is essential to avoid the imposition of disproportionate and overly burdensome conditions on premises where there is no need for such conditions.

### 5. CONSULTATION RESULTS AND PREVIOUS COMMITTEE FEEDBACK

5.1 Other than the statutory consultation described in Part 2 of the report above, no other consultation is required by the Licensing Act 2003.

### 6. NEXT STEPS: COMMUNICATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECISION

- 6.1 The Chairman will announce the Sub-Committee's decision prior to the conclusion of the hearing.
- 6.2 The applicant, any person who made relevant representations and the chief officer of police will subsequently receive written confirmation of the decision.
- 6.3 A copy of the Decision Notice will be placed on the Council's website.
- 6.4 In accordance with the provisions of Section 181 and Schedule 5, Licensing Act 2003 the applicant and any person who made a relevant representation has a right to appeal the decision made by the Licensing Authority. The appeal must be made to the Magistrates' Court within a period of twenty-one days from the date on which the appellant receives notification of the decision from the licensing authority.

promotion of the licensing objectives. Section 35(3) of the Licensing Act 2003 states 'where relevant representations are made, the authority must:-

- (a) hold a hearing to consider them, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
- (b) having regard to the representations, take such of the steps mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

Section 4(3) of the Licensing Act also requires the Licensing Authority to have regard to the published statement of the Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182

Each application that comes before the Sub-Committee must be treated on its own merits, and the Sub-Committee must take its decision based upon:

- a) The merits of the application
- b) The promotion of the four licensing objectives
- c) The policy of the Licensing Authority
- d) The Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003
- e) All valid representations made

Whilst the applicant, responsible authorities or persons making representations all have a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court dependant on the decision of the Sub Committee, the decision made takes immediate effect.

#### **Human Rights Act**

Article 1 of the First Protocol is concerned with the protection of property and provides that every person is entitled to peaceful enjoyment of his possessions. The term 'possessions' is given a broad definition and includes a licence.

Article 8 is concerned with the right to respect for private and family life. It states that Everyone has the right to respect for his private and family life, his home and his correspondence. There shall be no interference by a public authority with the exercise of this right except such as is

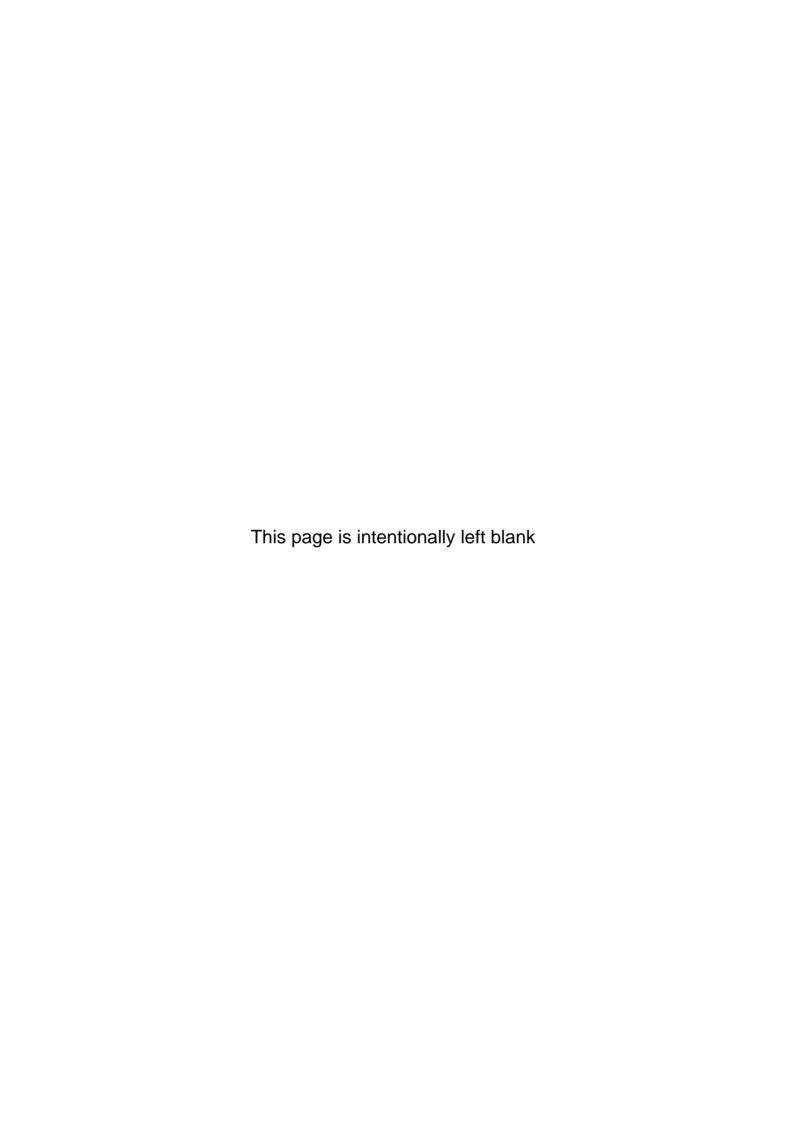

To whom it may concern,

I wish to object to the application 19/02940/LAPRE.

This business is directly opposite our house. During the day when it is open, patrons park on the main road outside the shop, narrowing the available room on West Road ( the A262 passing through Goudhurst village centre). This causes traffic delays on the A262 with the village often experiencing gridlock as traffic is unable to pass freely in both directions on this main road. It also makes crossing the road more dangerous as pedestrians are forced to cross the road from behind/infront of parked cars.

When a delivery lorry, HGV, or coach requires passage they usually have to drive up onto the pedestrian pavement outside our house in order to pass. Extending the opening hours beyond 4pm, to 10pm will make the traffic problems far worse, particularly during the afternoon school run and evening rush hour. The extended opening hours will significantly add to the traffic nuisance to local residents unable to pass through the village.

All of the rooms of our property face this business. Allowing opening until 10pm Monday through Saturday will significantly add to the noise level experienced by ourselves, and other local residents. In particular our young daughter's bedroom will be exposed to the additional noise of people entering and leaving the premises, the additional traffic, and the noise from the proposed live music. She currently attends Goudhurst Primary School (early years) and during school term time is in bed for 8pm. We do not have the possibility of moving to another room as all rooms in our property face out onto West Road.

Given that many patrons drive to the business (as demonstrated by the parking outside when it is open), the serving of alcohol with or without food, must increase the possibility of someone either deliberately or inadvertently driving from the premises under the influence of alcohol, thus increasing the probability of illegal activity taking place.

I hope that you will take these representations in mind when reviewing this licence application.
