Proposed Scheme	Improvement of drainage to Southwood Road football pitches.				
Outline of Proposal, including timescales	To improve the playing surface and drainage of three pitches at Southwood Road to include one small adult pitch and two 9 v 9 junior pitches. The project will need to be undertaken during the closed season starting in May 2021.				
Sources of funding	Capital Funding utilising S106 developer contributions.				
Objectives	Support the health of residents by improving sport and active recreation opportunities and contribute towards the Health Inequalities Action Plan.				
Benefits	The improvement of drainage using cultivation methods to improve the playing surface will increase the number of games played during the winter period and increase the income for the Council.				
How will the proposal contribute towards: Corporate Priority?	The Council formally adopted the current Playing Pitch Strategy in November 2017 to consider the future provision and management of sports pitches and needs to serve the communities across the Borough. The report was updated in 2019. The objectives of the PPS sets out the commitment to enhance playing pitches to maximise their full potential. The report undertook surveys of all the pitches and identified the pitches in Southwood Road as in need of improved drainage. The pitches currently support teams for both youth and adult football with 82 games played during the last full season.				
Local Area Agreement? Asset Management Plan?	The proposal is to improve the capacity of the soil to move water away from the playing surface using cultivation methods. The proposed work sits outside the current Grounds Maintenance contract and will aid drainage increasing the number of games played reducing the amount of lost income to the Council and decrease the negative publicity from users on social media.
