Hackney Carriage/Private Hire Vehicle Testing Contract

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT AND EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 This report advises Members of the recent Tendering exercise to award the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Testing Contract for the period 2018/2021.

2. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 s.50 (1) requires Proprietors of Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicles to have their vehicles tested at such a place within the area of the Council to ensure suitability for the use intended.
- 2.2 The previous Contract expired earlier this year; therefore it was necessary to retender the Contract. It should be noted that our existing contractors will continue to provide testing services until the award of the new Contract.
- 2.3 As the Borough is geographically extensive, the current Contract was operated by three testing stations to allow flexibility for Proprietors to arrange the required tests.
- 2.4 The Authority undertook a Tender exercise on 1st August 2018, seeking expressions of interest from appropriately qualified MOT testing centres within the Borough, who were required to complete a Tender submission online via the Kent Business Portal with the deadline being Friday 31st August.
- 2.5 The garages submitted a 'schedule of fees' to cover the costs of provision of the MOT and compliance testing arrangements.
- 2.6 We currently expend in the region of £30,000 per annum for the testing of vehicles, all costs associated with this Contract are recovered directly through the Hackney Carriage and Private Hire vehicle licence fees; therefore there is no cost to the Authority.
- 2.7 The timeline for the procurement is as follows:

Portal advert live – 1st August 2018
Tender submission deadline Friday 31st August
Evaluation to be completed by – 3 September
Committee approval/sign off – Tuesday 4th September
Contract award notification – Friday 7th September
Contract commence date – Monday 1st October

3. AVAILABLE OPTIONS

3.1 It is a legal requirement for vehicles to be subject to an MOT test, in addition the Council's testing regime also includes a range of additional checks over and above a standard MOT to ensure the vehicles satisfies the higher compliance standards set by the Council's Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy. These tests would also apply to vehicles less than three years old.

4. PREFERRED OPTION AND REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

4.1 To note the action taken to award the new Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicle Testing Contract, which will enable vehicles to be tested to ensure suitability for the use intended.
