### Air Quality Management in Tunbridge Wells

Local Air Quality Management (LAQM) is the process by which local authorities monitor, assess and take action to improve air quality.

Tunbridge Wells Council has worked with Kent County Council Highways and Transportation and Public Health to identify actions to improve air quality in the borough. We are now seeking the views of residents on the proposed actions.

It includes projects which can be delivered using existing knowledge and resources within the Council. It also includes ambitious projects which require extensive research and funding provision to deliver, for example, the development of a "Low Emissions Zone" for buses to fully identify the mechanisms, costs, risks and benefits. Projects of this nature if carried forward will be subject to individual reporting for approval prior to being implemented.

The most significant cause of poor air quality is pollution from vehicles, and the Council has drafted a variety of measures to reduce emissions from buses, taxis, freight and private cars.
